## **Activities:**

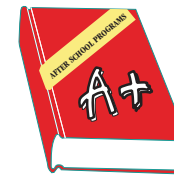

## **Cost**

## **Sample After-School Day**

60 minutes of designated academic time (math and science/reading).

Homework Help Center/Computer Technology: A comprehensive homework help and tutoring program designed to raise academic proficiency.

Physical Education: Basketball, kickball, football, volleyball, physical fitness, and nutrition.

Art and Drama: Students will showcase their artistic talent and self-expression. Plays will deal with topics such as self esteem, conflict resolution, mediation, and other life issues.
